I can put my returned books into the box beside the machine.



This is the help desk. If I have any questions I can ask a member of staff here.

I can also borrow or return books from here.



This is the children's section. I can sit and read books here. I can also play with the toys that are in the area.



If I want I can use the computers in the children's section. I must have a parent with me if I use the computers.



There are lots of toys and games available for me to play with. I can ask at reception if I want to play with them.



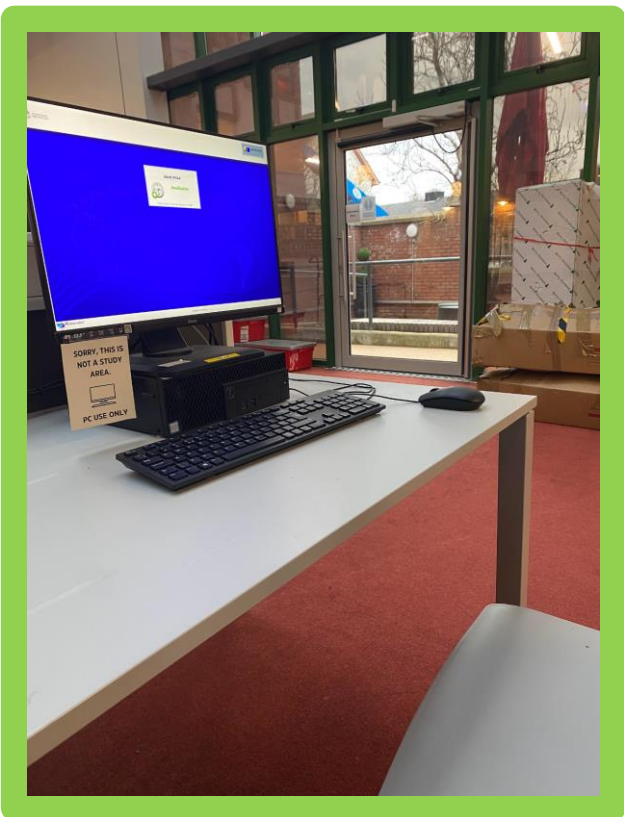
There is a booth that I can sit at where I can play games and do puzzles with my friends or family.

If I am an adult, there are lots of other computers that I can use.

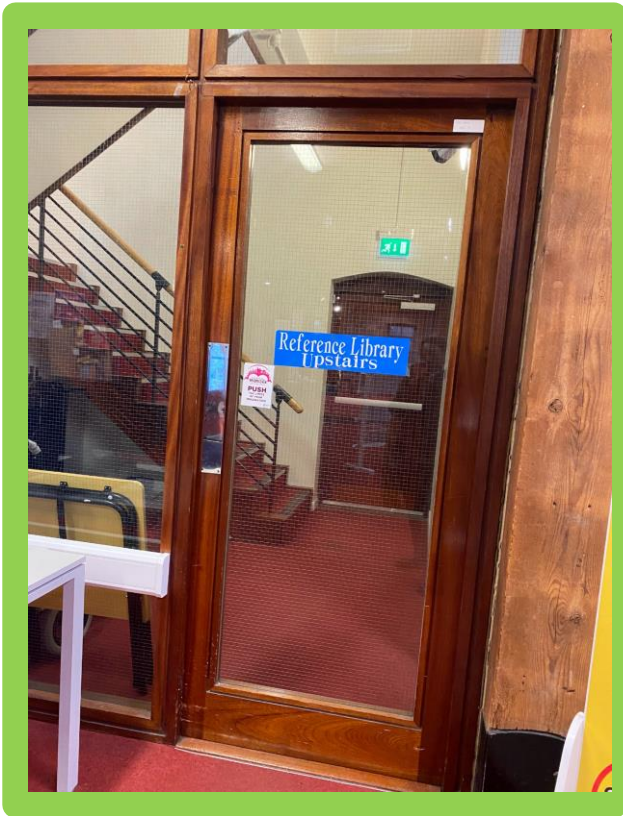


This is the 3d machine. I can make 3d models here. If I want to use it I should ask a member of staff to help me.



There are printers that I can use if I need to print out anything.

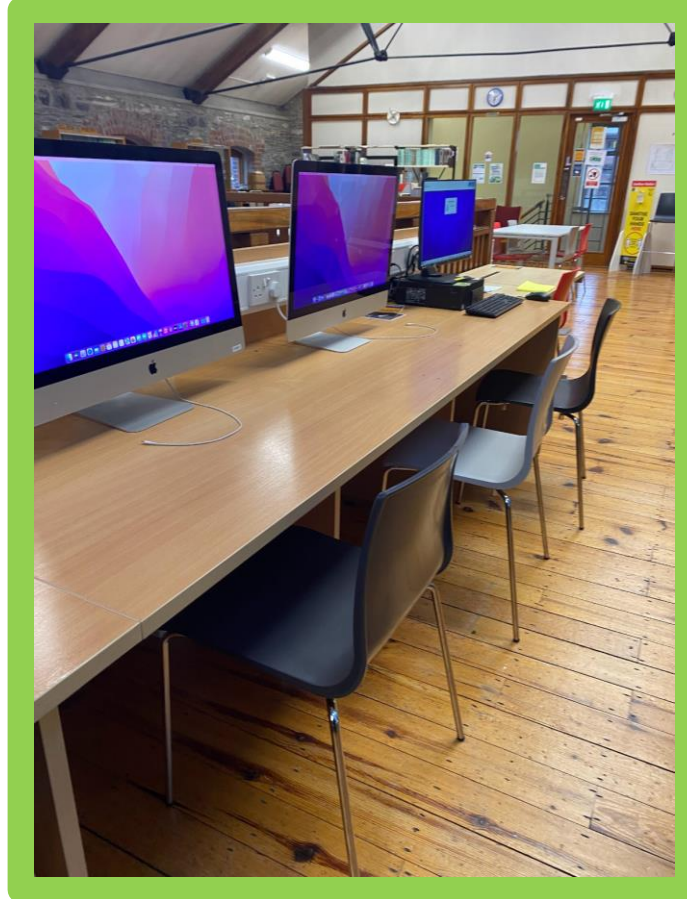
There are also lots of posters that show the local and library events that are happening.

This is a good place to study if I want to.

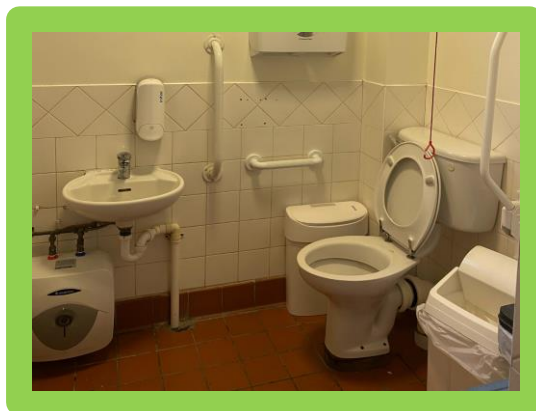


This is the magic table. Games are shone onto the table and I can play them on my own or with others.
